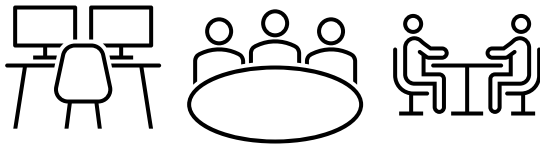


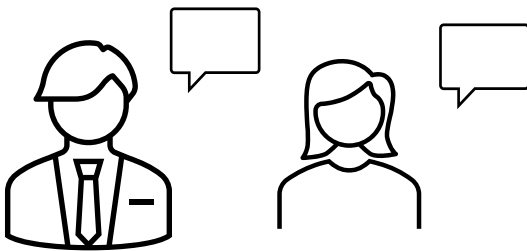
Action: Avatar on screen with speech bubble with written scenario.

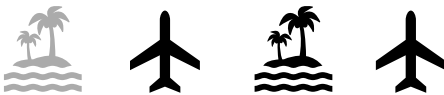
Action: First challenge involves dialogue with an employee of Workplace, Inc.

Text/Speech: Okay, David. Here's your chance. Your employee Emily has come to you before the meeting asking for an agenda she can review before the meeting starts. Choose your response: "Sure, here is one right here" or "This meeting is only going to be 5 minutes, so there is no agenda."



Action: Wrong answer is chosen, penalty is announced

Text/Speech: Oh no, David! Looks like you made a wrong choice! Agendas help employees understand the purpose of a meeting and saves time



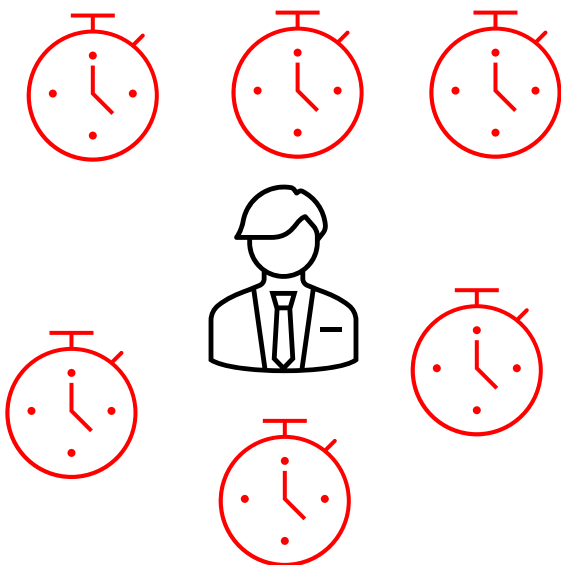
Action: Four weeks of vacation time represented as icons. The first icon is dimmed as one week of vacation time has been lost. Employee who asked for agenda is sleeping.

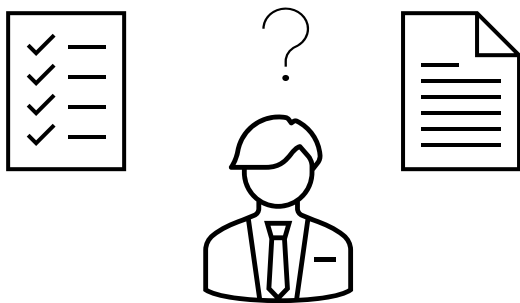
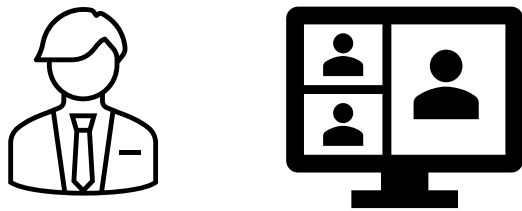
Text/Speech: Without an agenda, Emily will not know what to pay attention to in the meeting. She has fallen asleep for the day out of boredom and your office has lost productivity as a result. Therefore, you lost a week of vacation. Better luck, next time!



Action: "Evil clocks" surround David Workman, he is to make it through to the next meeting while battling them and not letting them touch him. Each of them have "time wasters" written next to them.

Text/Speech: Okay David, get through to the Evil Clock Valley. Your job is to get through without letting any of the clocks waste your time or your employees' time. Let's get started!





Action: David makes it to the next meeting. Two weeks of his vacation time is gone, as he allowed one of the “time wasters” from Evil Clock Valley to touch him. One meeting destination is greyed out.

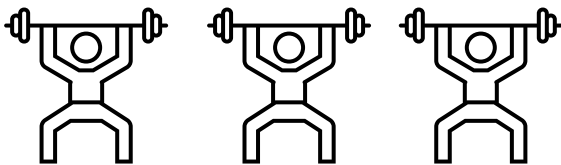
Text/Speech: Congratulations David, you’ve made it through Evil Clock Valley with some vacation time left! But be careful, you’re cutting it close! Choose your next meeting destination!

Action: David makes it to the next meeting. Two weeks of his vacation time is gone, as he allowed one of the “time wasters” from Evil Clock Valley to touch him. One meeting destination is greyed out.

Text/Speech: Alright David, your team is depending on you! You are now in a project management meeting to help your staff get their tasks done.

Action: David has a checklist on the left and a document on the right.

Text/Speech: In this meeting, you want to help your team be productive on a very important project. What will make your team more productive in completing their part of the project? Reading out a checklist of everyone’s task or Everyone working on a common document detailing what they have gotten done? Choose wisely!



Action: Hand cursor chooses document on the right. Arrow to go to the next challenge is present.

Text/Speech: Great job! A common document that everyone where everyone can work on the task together is much more effective than just reminding the team of everyone’s role in the project.

Action: One week of vacation time has been restored due to the correct decision. Last meeting challenge is shown, the rest are greyed.

Text/Speech: Congratulations you have gained one more week of vacation time!

Action: All of David’s employees have gained 20 pounds of muscle since he built a stronger team. He will be given the choice to take these strong employees with him into the next challenge to fight off “time wasters” and the like.

Text/Speech: As a result of your great leadership and effective meeting planning, your staff has gained 20 pounds of muscle! Take them with you in the next challenge before you tackle your last and most challenging meeting.
